

Comité des sans-emploi (CSE)

The CSE brings together the unemployed, people receiving government assistance and the working poor for the defense and promotion of their rights and their collective interests. It participates in initiatives and campaigns to amend and change legislation for the benefit of their members and users. It works in collaboration with the Welfare Rights Committee in order to offer bilingual services.

Activities

- Services for the defense of individual rights : information, accompanying, representation for questions related to Social Assistance
- Monthly community dinners: after the free hot dinner, there is a public meeting touching on various aspects of Social Assistance or other subjects affecting people who are unemployed or in precarious employment
- · Coffee-chats: various selected topics
- · Social and Cultural Activities: musical evenings to bring together the different generations and cultural communities of the neighbourhood

It aims for social change and the adoption of policies that favour social justice and the dignity of all. It works in collaboration with the Comité des sansemploi in order to offer bilingual services.

Activities

- Services for the defense of individual rights : information and accompanying for questions pertaining to social assistance or other related programs
- Coffee-chats and information sessions : discussing various aspects of Social Assistance, other social programs or even current events, campaigns in progress or planned collective actions
- Community dinners followed by public assemblies: information and exchange of ideas on questions of community interest
- Social and cultural activities: musical evenings that help bring together people of different generations or ethnicities

Very active in food security to fight against poverty and social exclusion, the Club makes it easier to have access to healthy, varied and affordable food. It works for the improvement of the social, economic and health conditions of the citizens of the neighbourhood through public education, defense of rights and political action.

Activities

- Collective gardens: urban gardening in groups, with the work and harvests shared amongst participants, a place to meet and learn; workshops and outings to the greenhouse
- Community and collective kitchens: discovering recipes, sharing food and costs, the joy of cooking and eating together, access to healthy and affordable meals (from \$1-\$2/portion)
- Themed workshops: bread, soup, tourtière, jams, cookies, baby food, kefir/kombucha. herbalism. seeds
- Collective Grocery: more than 300 products; fresh fruits and vegetables, meats, eggs, milk, cheese, jams, rice, pastas, flour, honey, spices, nuts, snacks. Calendar available on site
- Collective Markets: fresh fruits and vegetables at affordable prices

Clinique communautaire de Pointe-Saint-Charles

The Clinic is a community organization that serves as the CLSC for the territory of Point St. Charles. It offers health and social services, while doing prevention and directly addressing the causes of disease. Its goal is to bring citizens together in order to improve their health conditions, both in the short and long terms.

Its board of directors is constituted primarily of neighbourhood citizens elected during the annual general assembly. At the heart of its orientations is the conviction that health is an essential, collective and non-negotiable right! The Clinic is the health and solidarity of a neighbourhood.

Activities

Medical care, nursing, psychosocial support, mental health, home care, vaccination, sexual health, pre-natal courses, breastfeeding, dental hygiene in schools, syringe exchanges, resources and referrals, community development, etc.

You can also get involved in different Clinic committees and be an active participant in the use of collective power acting for the improvement of health and living conditions of the population.

Naître à La Pointe

Born in the Point is a citizen-run collective formed in 2010 to request a birthing centre in order to better serve future mothers of Point St. Charles and their families. Firmly rooted in its neighbourhood, the collective envisions a citizen-focused birthing centre, ideally within the walls of Building 7, where future mothers' autonomy will be respected. The service users will have a central role in the orientations and practises of the birthing centre, as well as in the hosting of activities.

The project is now managed by the Clinique communautaire de Pointe-Saint-Charles, in collaboration with local partners from the health sector, Born in the Point and Familles en action. The project has received the green light from the Ministry of Health and future mothers will finally be able to benefit from midwifery services some time in 2018!

Activities

- Popular education that aims to transform the dominant culture of childbirth, marked by fear, control and over-medicalization
- · Monitoring of the implementation of midwifery services
- · Monitoring of the implementation of the birthing centre

Projet suivi communautaire

The organization is an alternative mental health resource offering individual community follow-up care services in order to ensure wellbeing and quality of life. As part of a personalized treatment plan, the individual is accompanied while respecting their self-identified needs.

Activities

Long term community follow-up care

- Listening and support
- · Objectives to meet, based on expressed needs
- · Support for involvement in the community
- Accompanying people in the learning of skills necessary for living autonomously: budgeting, socialization, defense of rights, etc

Charles-Lemoyne School

The school offers classes that follow the regular preschool and elementary program, alternative classes based on the Célestin Freinet approach as well as services from the school board for students with severe language difficulties. The children benefit from a harmonious learning environment.

- Extra-curricular: help with homework in collaboration with Saint Columba House and the El Sistema music program from Share the Warmth, introduction of all students to the sciences
- · Sports activities: basket-ball and soccer
